

Storm Drain Inlet Labeling Program

The SEMSWA storm drain inlet labeling program consists of affixing decals to inlets along streets in your neighborhood. The colorful decals remind people that nothing should go into the storm drain inlet except rain, and that dumping “wastes” into the inlets allows these wastes to eventually make their way into our drainageways, creeks, rivers and lakes. “Wastes” can be everyday by-products of household chores such as oil and grease spills, dog wastes, fertilizer and pesticides, as well as car washing detergents.

The storm drain inlet labeling program attempts to tie the activities we do around the house to potential sources of pollution in our drainageways and creeks, as well as expand on the important relationship that each of each of us have as stewards in our watersheds.

*Optimum temperature is 40° F minimum to 90°
Surface should be clean and dry*



Peel backing from one side of the adhesive.



*Stick adhesive to storm drain marker and **STICK IT** above the inlet.*
